

South County Women's Club: \$300 for a new garden therapy workshop at local nursing homes. Club volunteers supervised residents who create their own floral arrangement using containers and flowers provided by our Club.

RI Federation of Garden Clubs Community Service Grant Drawing: Awarded \$250 for our Daffodil Project. The grant helped to fund the purchase of over 3,500 daffodils which were planted in seven locations throughout the community.

Bayer Crop Science "Feed a Bee Pollinator Health Forage Initiative" \$2,500 grant. Funds will be used to expand the pollinator garden we developed in partnership with the North Kingstown Water Department at Casey Farm, and to provide educational materials for school children, and on-site signage explaining the importance of the garden.

My name is Chris McCormick, I am a Junior in the Bachelors of Landscape Architecture program at the University of Rhode Island. I am the 2017-18 recipient of the Plum Beach Garden Club Scholarship. I want to express my immense gratitude for your generosity, and give you a little background on who I am.

I am a first generation college student from Cranston, RI. Throughout high school I had no idea where I would end up or what I would study. I changed my intended major from entrepreneurship, to music education, to geography. After graduating high school and taking some classes at the Community College of Rhode Island, I knew I wanted to study architecture. I couldn't afford to study at local private colleges, or distant state schools, so I found my way to the B.L.A. program at URI. I quickly realized how lucky I was to wind up here. The sacrifices have been undeniable, and I am thrilled to say that they are finally paying off. Hussey Bridge Garden

Anne Wallau Garden





The charming garden in the corner of Updike Park in Wickford was funded by Anne's friends and family in her memory. Plum Beach Garden Club members planned and planted the garden in 1996, and continue to maintain it.

Gilbert Stuart Herb Garden

For decades, Plum Beach Garden Club has been tending this treasure at Gilbert Stuart's birthplace. In 2003, more than \$3,000 was raised by PBGC to renovate and expand this replica of an 18th century garden.





Daffodil Project

In the Fall of 2016, the PBGC planted hundreds of daffodils to kick off a new community beautification project. This will be a long term effort, and over the years the club plans to plant tens of thousands of daffodils in highly visible locations throughout North Kingstown.



The project will be led by PBGC and a variety of organizations, merchants, students and residents will be encouraged to participate.

The Pollinator Rescue Project



The Pollinator Rescue Project of Rhode Island is a collaboration of organizations dedicated to protecting and encouraging the proliferation pollinator species that are endangered.

Through education and demonstration, they show how the simple

principles and methods of establishing a pollinator friendly garden can be accomplished on any scale.

Members of the collaboration include Plum Beach Garden Club, North Kingstown Water Dept., N.K. Groundwater Committee, Casey Farm/Historic New England, Rhode Island Wild Plant Society and Blue Moon Farm Perennials.

So far, three pollinator habitats have been established—the North Kingstown Senior Center, the Slocum Water Tank, and Casey Farm.



Historic Wickford Sign

Members coordinated and paid for the refurbishing of the Historic Wickford sign near the old Town Hall on Route 1A, and the Club maintain the landscaping around the sign. This was one of the first locations that benefited from the Daffodil Project in 2016.

Blue Star Memorial Islands



The three traffic islands at the intersection of Route 1 and West Main Street are considered the "Gateway to Wickford Village".

Plum Beach Garden Club spent four years working to get state and local approvals to beautify this high-profile location. They planned and designed the space, and raised \$50,000 to accomplish this project. The Club was able to replicate the beautiful Welcome to Wickford sign thanks to a generous donation of \$6,000 from the Wickford Historical Society.

In 2009 the efforts of this major project were rewarded when it was designated and dedicated as a Blue Start Memorial By-Way.

Blue Star Memorial markers are part of a nationwide network honoring our country's Armed Forces, a program started by National Garden Clubs after WWII.

This is a RIDOT Adopt-A-Spot location.





Garden Therapy Workshops

PBGC members visit local nursing homes during the year to help the residents create flower arrangements for their rooms. In 2017 this outreach project received a Grow Hope Community Grant from the South County Women's Club.

Holiday Decorations

Each year Plum Beach Garden Club decorates and hangs a wreath at the North Kingstown Police and Fire Headquarters.
