Standing Rules

- RSVP required for each meeting.
- Dues are payable before the first meeting of the year.
- Active members must attend five meetings annually.

Hostess Duties

- 1. Appoint a Chair and an RSVP contact person for the event to be published in the yearbook.
- 2. Spend up to \$25 per hostess (non-reimbursable) for the purchase of refreshments, paper products, and a table centerpiece.
- 3. Set up and break down the meeting space.
- 4. Find their own replacement in the event they are unable to fulfill their duties.
- 5. Committee members who plan larger events, or ones different from a regular monthly meeting, shall create written budgets which will enable them to determine additional member and guest fees, and the need to request additional funding beyond the \$25 each hostess contributes. These budgets, along with a request for additional funds, shall be submitted to the Executive Committee for approval in advance.
- 6. All receipts for reimbursement of expenses beyond \$25 per person shall be submitted to the Treasurer immediately following the meeting.

Monthly Hostess Chair

- 1. Initiate meeting planning.
- 2. Work closely with the Hospitality Chair and Program Chair in planning when necessary for special meetings.
- 3. Maintain the hostesses supplies box with the key to the church and pass it on to the next Hospitality Committee.
- 4. Write a description of the Committee's activities and expenses to be added to a Hospitality Handbook maintained by the Hospitality Chair.


